



### What can an RPCS Capstone Fellowship look like?

- Design a school of the future: Intern at a local school, conduct research and interviews with students, faculty and school leadership, examine podcasts, books and new concepts to rethink how education could be structured and delivered to future generations.
- Utilize art to support impoverished communities: Merge an interest in the international culture and arts (ceramics, photography, music, dance) with commerce (the buying and selling of products) to build the capacity of underserved communities of the world and disrupt the cycle of poverty.
- Improve healthcare accessibility: Explore the issue of access to healthcare in low-income communities and the barriers that exist while finding ways to empower specific communities to better understand their options and how they can make quality medical care a reality.
- Improve transportation accessibility: Explore the issue of access to public transportation for elderly, low-income or disabled populations while finding ways to find creative and practical solutions that empower these communities.
- Intervene to improve youth literacy rates: Work with literacy non-profits, city schools or other educational programs to explore through research the reasons why low-income students typically have lower literacy rates and what can be done to intervene and set students up for success.
